

### **Catholic Declaration on Life and Death**

The Catholic Declaration on Life and Death is a health care advance directive for Florida's Catholics and is approved by the Bishops of Florida. This directive conforms to both Florida law and the teaching of the Church.

### What is an "advance directive"?

There are two forms of advance directives: the designation of **health care surrogate**, which authorizes a person to make decisions for the incapacitated patient, and the **living will**, which gives instructions to physicians and caregivers regarding medical care and treatment at the end of life. The Catholic Declaration on Life and Death merges both forms into one directive.

# CHURCH Etiquette

- ATTIRE The idea of Sunday best should be honored; churchgoers of all ages should dress conservatively. Coat and tie is appropriate for men, but not required. Women should wear modest dresses, skirts and slacks; no tank tops, short skirts or tight-fitting clothing.
- ARRIVAL Offering envelopes should be prepared ahead of time. Arrive at least 10 minutes before Mass begins. This helps reduce distractions and provides time to get settled. Latecomers should wait to be seated by ushers so as not to disrupt the Mass and the congregation. Please avoid chewing gum or eating candy when coming to Mass.

ENTERING THE CHURCH Once you enter the Church, please refrain from over socializing with others. Remember that others are already engaged in prayer in their seats. It is optional to bless yourself with holy water, but as a sign of respect for the Blessed Sacrament, genuflect (bow if you are unable to genuflect) before taking your seat. Move to the center of the pew to accommodate others who arrive after you.

QUIET TIME Turn off cell phones and pagers. It is understandable that children may have difficulty sitting quietly, but when they become distracting, take them out briefly until they settle down. They may simply need a change of environment. The Narthex is an appropriate place to take them.

- SIGN OF PEACE People usually shake hands or exchange a quick kiss, but if you have a cold or cough, you can politely say, "Peace be with you," without shaking hands.
- CONSECRATION Elevation of the Host and Chalice after the words of consecration are spoken is a sacred time, and there should be silent reverence with no movement around the church, except in an emergency.
- COMMUNION Again, please refrain from socializing when leaving the pew to receive Communion. Receive the holy Eucharist with reverence, bow slightly and respond "Amen."
- LEAVING THE CHURCH The final part of Mass is singing a closing hymn. Leaving before the hymn ends is inappropriate. Genuflect (or bow) toward the altar before leaving. Refrain from greeting and visiting each other until leaving the church. Have respect for those who wish to remain in prayer.

# RESPECT LIFE TRENDS

Roe v. Wade was overturned as the law-of-the-land in June of 2022. Many thought that would end the scourge of abortion, but it only returned the matter to the people in individual states. What about our Florida?

The initial response was an increase in abortions. The almost 75,000 abortions performed in 2021 increased

to more than 82,000 in 2022 and to 84,000 in 2023. With the beginning of the heartbeat bill in 2024, things have started to change. Total numbers were down 13% from '22 and '23 in the first 8 months of 2024. (wusf.org)

What does the future hold? It's hard to tell. The unrestricted abortions promised in Amendment 4 fell when 42.8% of us opposed it. Yet, with the proliferation of medical abortions by telehealth and pills in the mail, it's a new world.

Babies aborted this week from Charlotte County: *Silas, Amelia, and Willow.* Abortions dropped in Florida during 2024 since the heartbeat bill became law in May '24, but we still see too many early medical abortions. Numbers may soon change, but, for now, please spiritually adopt one of these babies.



# Statement of the Bishops of Florida on the Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children

January 22, 2025

Informed by the divinely revealed truth that the human being is made in the image and likeness of God (Genesis 2:26-27), as Christians we care for all of God's children, especially the most vulnerable among us. On this Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children, we renew our call to pray and work for a culture that protects life in the womb and offers loving support to all mothers, fathers, and families.

Florida celebrated two major milestones over the past year. First, the Florida Supreme Court reversed the finding in the 1989 legal case, *In Re: TW*, that bent the state constitution's right to privacy to include a broad right to abortion. We celebrate the overturning of this longstanding wrong in Florida jurisprudence. This ruling paved the way for the Heartbeat Protection Act, which restricts the intentional taking of the life of an unborn child at 6 weeks of gestation, to go into effect.

Second, in the November election, Amendment 4 was defeated. This proposed amendment to Florida's constitution was pushed by a well-funded effort spreading misinformation about women's healthcare and current abortion law. If passed, it would have removed nearly all regulation of abortion up to viability and well beyond.

The Church in Florida made a considerable effort to help defeat Amendment 4, and we thank the many people of goodwill who worked in defense of the innocent preborn. We are grateful that voters rejected this amendment, but we also recognize that many of our fellow citizens voted in its favor and that much work remains. While the Heartbeat Protection Act has significantly decreased the number of abortions, the unfortunate reality is that abortions continue to be performed in Florida at a high rate.

Most of the important work in building a culture of life is undertaken outside the legislature and the courts. We must advance protections for unborn children and their mothers by communicating with compassion the truth

These initiatives meet and accompany women in difficult situations who are often told that they have no choice but to seek abortion and provide them with love, dignity, and practical resources.

We give thanks to those who have embraced the calling to marriage and family life and witness to us generously, as well as to those who help to prepare and support husbands and wives living their vocations. New life is welcomed in marriage and nourished in the family. This helps each child and ultimately all of society to flourish. As St. John Paul II famously noted, "In the face of the so-called culture of death, the family is the heart of the culture of life." (*Centessimus Annus*, no. 39, May 1, 1991)

Despite challenges, we remain confident in the Lord Jesus, who draws close to all those who suffer. With prayer and fasting, through the intercession of Mary, we ask Jesus to have mercy on our state and our nation and to bring about laws that protect every human life and banish every form of injustice. To all who have experienced the harm of abortion, there is always mercy and forgiveness in Jesus Christ. We invite all people to join in building a civilization of love in which every human being is valued and loved.
