It is actually a seven-week season of the church year called Eastertide, the fifty days that begins at the Easter Vigil and lasts for six more Sundays until Pentecost Sunday. We celebrate the Lord's Resurrection, His Ascension and Pentecost.

However you celebrate this time, remember that you are commemorating the Resurrection of Jesus and celebrating the defeat of death and the hope of salvation.




An offering for the Sanctuary Candle Memorial is \$20.

A Message from Fr. John Why Are We Here???

Easter brings every Catholic together within the context of the Mass, both those on the fringes of Christian life and those fully committed as Jesus' disciples.

For many decades now, the Church has been fighting a battle to keep Christians Christian, to keep Catholics Catholic. Yet, in many ways, we seem to be losing ground, especially amongst the younger generation. Fallen away Catholics are one of the problems in our nation, as they

choose to live out their lives more and more according to what our culture teaches, instead of what God teaches. They allow the "world," as Jesus referred to it, to form their consciences and basic belief systems.

Many fallen away Catholics see their happiness as emanating from and in the world, and prefer to be accepted and formed by the culture (secular and political philosophies and ideologies) rather than by God and His Church. Others claim they don't need organized religion in order to worship God. But more than anything else, I believe that fallen away Catholics don't see the relevancy of attending Mass, the relevancy of being a Disciple of Christ, especially when compared to the transient attractions of the world.

Does Mass matter? Mass empowers us to live life more fully, to live life most fully. This is why we reach out to lost and fallen away Catholics. We do not reach out to these people so that the Church can be more relevant in the world (relevancy in God's eyes is all we need), but so that their individual lives can be more relevant, period; so that they can be empowered to live life most fully, so that they can be love for others as fully possible.

Mass matters, and what we receive at Mass cannot be replicated anywhere else. We are fed and nourished during Mass by God so that we can become our truest selves, so that we can become ever more fully, who God created us to be, so that we can become "another Christ" in and for the world. Mass empowers us to not just be "good people," but to be the best people, the best mirror image of Christ that we can possibly be.

The more we receive spiritual nourishment, including especially the spiritual nourishment we receive at Mass, the freer we become, the stronger we become so that we can become ever more empowered to say "yes" to God, to say "yes" to doing and saying whatever God asks us to do and to say.

To choose to live a life without regularly attending Mass limits and diminishes our lives in the here and now, which adversely affects our choices for eternity. Please don't fast from God. Allow this heavenly Easter banquet to be the beginning of your weekly feasting on the spiritual food that will empower you to most fully become the person you were created to be, the person that deep down you desire to be more than anything else.

Have a blessed Easter, and I pray that we see you next weekend!





The St. Charles Borromeo School's Eighth Grade will be hosting a car wash fundraiser next Sunday, April 27th, for a graduation trip to Orlando.



GUIDELINES FOR

RECEIVING COMMUNION

FOR CATHOLICS

Catholics fully participate in the celebration of the Eucharist when they receive Holy Communion in fulfillment of Christ's commandment to eat His Body and drink His Blood. In order to be properly disposed to receive Communion, communicants should not be conscious of grave sin, have fasted for an hour, and seek to live in charity and love with their neighbors. Persons conscious of grave sin must first be reconciled with God and the Church through the sacrament of Penance. A frequent reception of the sacrament of Penance is encouraged for all.

FOR OTHER CHRISTIANS

We welcome to this celebration of the Eucharist those Christians who are not fully united with us. It is a consequence of the sad divisions in Christianity that we cannot extend to them a general invitation to receive Communion. Catholics believe that the Eucharist is an action of the celebrating community signifying a oneness in faith, life, and worship of the community. Reception of the Eucharist by Christians not fully united with us would imply a oneness which does not yet exist, and for which we must all pray.

FOR THOSE NOT RECEIVING COMMUNION

Those not receiving sacramental Communion are encouraged to express in their hearts a prayerful desire for unity with our Lord Jesus and with one another.

FOR NON-CHRISTIANS

We also welcome to this celebration those who do not share our faith in Jesus. While we cannot extend to them an invitation to receive Communion, we do invite them to be united with us in prayer.

FLCAN

RESPECT LIFE CATHOLIC DAYS AT THE CAPITOL 2025

What legal issues are the Florida Bishops (FLCAN - Florida Catholic Advocacy Network) working on? With a heartbeat bill firmly in place to protect the unborn, the focus has changed.

- First, an assisted suicide bill has been introduced in Florida. It is not going anywhere yet, but it is still concerning.
- Second, a bill expanding the death penalty will probably pass. That is disappointing because eliminating executions in Florida is a FLCAN goal.
- Third, an ongoing goal is to improve the infrastructure of Florida's prisons. Multi-billion dollar repairs are needed but not funded.
- FLCAN has high hopes for a bill requiring grades 6-12 to teach human embryology and fetal development in health care classes. This is not, directly, an anti-abortion bill, but it is certainly a step in the right direction. For decades, abortion clinics, like Planned Parenthood, have used the term "blob" to describe unborn humans. Knowledge is Power! (FCCB Packet, 3/18/2025)

Abortions dropped in Florida during 2024 since the heartbeat bill became law in May, but we still see too many early medical abortions. Please spiritually adopt *Ryan*, *Rachel*, *and Olivia*.



¿En qué asuntos legales están trabajando los Obispos de Florida (FLCAN - Red Católica de Defensa de Florida)? Con un proyecto de ley sobre el latido del corazón firmemente establecido para proteger a los no nacidos, el enfoque na cambiado.

- Primero, se ha presentado en Florida un proyecto de ley sobre suicidio asistido. Aún no se ha desvanecido, pero sigue siendo preocupante.
- Segundo, probablemente se apruebe un proyecto de ley que amplía la pena de muerte. Esto es decepcionante, ya que eliminar las ejecuciones en Florida es un objetivo de FLCAN.
- Tercero, un objetivo permanente es mejorar la infraestructura de las prisiones de Florida. Se necesitan reparaciones multimillonarias, pero no están financiadas.
- FLCAN tiene grandes esperanzas en un proyecto de ley que exija que los grados 6.° a 12.° enseñen embriología humana y desarrollo fetal en las clases de atención médica. Este no es, directamente, un proyecto de ley contra el aborto, pero sin duda es un paso en la dirección correcta. Durante décadas, las clínicas de aborto, como Planned Parenthood, han utilizado el término "blob" para describir a los no nacidos. ¡El Conocimiento es Poder! (Paquete FCCB, 18/3/2025)

Los abortos disminuyeron en Florida durante 2024 desde que se promulgó la ley del latido del corazón en Mayo, pero aún vemos demasiados abortos médicos tempranos. Por favor, adopten espiritualmente a Ryan, Rachel, and Olivia.


